MEET BYNX! THE ILWC AMBASSADOR

Laguna Greenbelt, Inc. is proud to introduce our newest project with a friendly furry face, Bynx the Bobcat! Bynx is the official ambassador of the Irvine-Laguna Wildlife Corridor (ILWC). His purpose is to help educate the local residents of Orange County about the significant importance of habitat connectivity. The ILWC will soon connect the fragmented habitats of the Cleveland National Forest in the North and the Laguna Coast Wilderness in the South. Bynx will guide us through portions of the corridor and introduce us to his furry and feathered friends.

The inspiration behind Bynx the Bobcat came from real wildlife encounters with a Bobcat in the greater Irvine area. Initially spotted in 2015 near the University of California, Irvine (UCI), the Bobcat was captured by the City of Irvine Animal Control and placed under the care of USGS's Dr. Scott Weldy to be treated for mange as a result of rodenticide ingestion. Prior to his release back into the wilderness, the bobcat was fitted with a pink/lavender ID tag and given the official name BNX, commonly pronounced as "Bynx"!

In January 2016, local wildlife photographers Jodi Newell and Marcia Gonzalez (right) captured photos of Binx in an Irvine wetland looking healthy. While reported sightings of Bynx have not been made in recent years, other bobcats in the greater Irvine area will surely benefit from the ILWC.



The wonderful illustrations you see in this newsletter were created by the talented Evie Andrade, a recent graduate from UCI. She drew inspiration from past photos of BNX and worked with the ILWC working group to create friendly depictions of our native wildlife. We are excited to use these illustrations to emphasize the importance of the Wildlife Corridor.

Bynx the Bobcat will not only be seen on social media, but he will soon be an interactive education tool. We want to expand our audience and welcome local families and community members to engage in science and education about our local flora and fauna. The Wildlife Corridor website now features a webpage, "Bynx's Den", dedicated to children and families and will soon contain fun activities like print materials to create a diorama of our coastal sage scrub ecosystem and an activity guide for a scavenger hunt!
